MSU Broad Art Museum Begins Construction on Major Lower-Level Renovation

East Lansing, MI – The Eli and Edythe Broad Art Museum at Michigan State University (MSU Broad Art Museum) has started construction on The Center for Object Research and Engagement (The CORE)—an active educational space for our permanent collection that will encourage close looking, learning, and diverse experiences with art. With a collection of over 10,000 works, the MSU Broad Art Museum’s lower-level transformation will bring many artworks out of storage and on view for the public to enjoy.

The MSU Broad Art Museum will remain open throughout construction during normal public hours of Wednesday–Sunday, 10am–6pm, with plenty of art and exhibitions on view. The Eli and Edythe Broad Art Museum at Michigan State University (MSU Broad Art Museum) connects people with art through experiences that inspire curiosity and inquiry. Presenting exhibitions and programs that engage diverse communities around issues of local

relevance and global significance, the MSU Broad Art Museum advances the university values of quality, inclusion, and connectivity. Opened on November 10, 2012, the museum was designed by Pritzker Prize-winning architect Zaha Hadid and named in honor of Eli and Edythe Broad, longtime supporters of the university who provided the lead gift for its creation.
