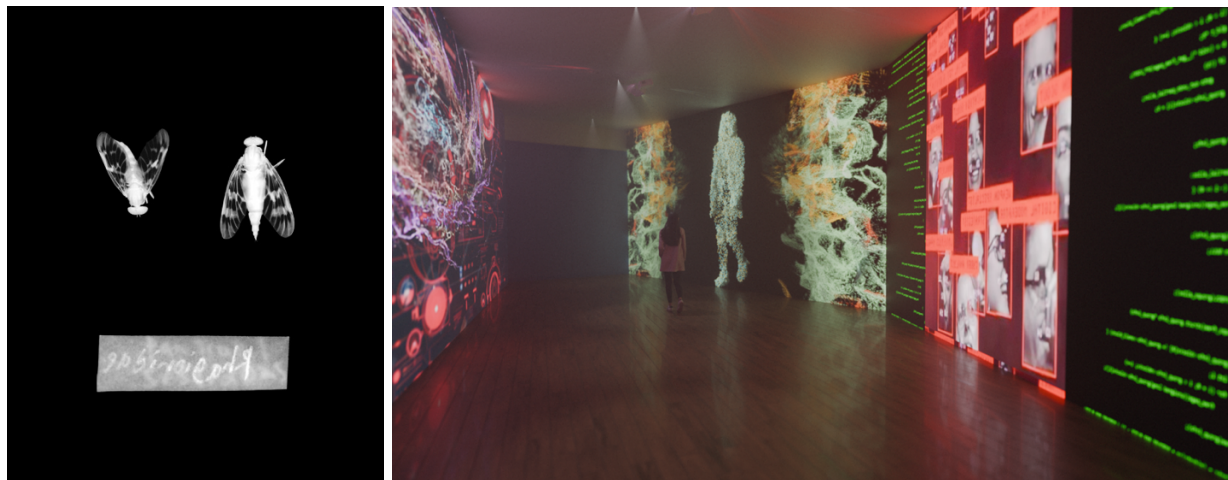

2026 WINTER OPENING PARTY CELEBRATES MSU BROAD ART MUSEUM'S NEWEST EXHIBITIONS

This winter, warm your heart with some cozy art!

East Lansing, MI – Join the Eli and Edythe Broad Art Museum at Michigan State University (MSU Broad Art Museum) and Michigan State University Federal Credit Union (MSUFCU) for the museum's annual Winter Opening Party on Friday, January 30, from 6–9pm. All are invited to check out the museum's newest exhibitions while enjoying music from Impact 89FM, art-making activities—like collaging zines—and more.

This event celebrates the exhibitions *Jan Tichy: Darkness* (Jan. 31–Jul. 26, 2026), *Synthetic Sirens* (Jan. 31–Jul. 12, 2026), *Mekong Voices: Transnational River Justice in Mainland Southeast Asia* (Sep. 14, 2025–Feb. 22, 2026), *Seeing in 360 Degrees: The Zaha Hadid Design Collection* (Sep. 8, 2023–ongoing), and The Center for Object Research and Engagement (The CORE).

During the Winter Opening Party, be sure to stop by a special hands-on, Shadow Lab in The CORE, found on the lower level of the museum. Led by Steve Baibak, artist and academic specialist in MSU's Residential College in the Arts and Humanities, this shadow-making station invites visitors to experiment with light, darkness, movement, and collaboration.

Visitors are encouraged to reserve their free tickets in advance to attend the Winter Opening Party at broadmuseum.msu.edu. All ages are welcome to this museum-wide party!
